Church Leadership in Rural America The Battle of Insecurity

JUD. 6:1-10.

1 - Is God against us because of evil?

2 - Are we hiding in dens, caves, and the strongholds of the mountains?

3-4 - Is something always taking our provision away?

5 - Is the battle so lopsided?

6 - Are we truly crying out to the Lord or just complaining about the Lord?

7-9 - Have you forgotten what God has already done for you?

10 - Did you forget what God has said to you?

- Has fear kept you from obeying His voice?

* The battle of insecurity happens in times of opportunity.

JUD.6:12-16.

12 - you mighty man of valor - God's opinion of us is always higher than our experiences allow!

* Insecurity is the acceptance of your opinion of you, encouraged by your perception of other's opinions of you, over God's opinion of you.

13 - why then has this happened to us? Where are the miracles? Why is God forsaking us? - the circumstances are an opportunity to question God or trust Him.

* Insecurity trusts experiences (self-worth by results) AND wonders if God is around.

14 - Go in this might of yours - God never uses circumstances to assess ability.

- how can I save Israel - once your self-worth is determined by personal circumstances you cannot possibly do what God intends.

*Self-assessment and self-rejection are the greatest enemies of proper spiritual life - they directly opposed the value paid for you in Christ.

15 - my clan is the weakest - once your strength is determined you cannot possibly do what God intends.

- I am the least - once size is determined you cannot possibly do what God intends.

* Insecurity uses constant comparisons, lack of giftedness, and general competency to prove why it won't work.

The heresy behind your perception of a lack of giftedness and competency is the logical extension that with more giftedness and competency you can fix the problem.

16 - defeat - strike as one. Used to describe God as Jehovah Nakah (the Lord who strikes, EZE, 7:9)

* Insecurity refuses the "inside out function" of God in us.

Phil. 2:12, "Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling;"

* Real Change only takes place from the inside out. Ultimately the invisible Kingdom on the inside becomes the visible Kingdom around you.
